

Ingredients Checklist

This list was developed to assist custodians in identifying the hazards of ingredients in *common cleaning and maintenance products*.

Although all cleaning chemicals need to be *used with caution*, some cleaning chemicals are more toxic than others and should be avoided. The following table is a list of cleaning chemicals that should be avoided whenever possible.

Custodial staff should keep safety in mind and wear personal protective equipment as recommended by each manufacturer.
